Learning Intentions and Success Criteria

Every lesson at the College begins with a Learning Intention and Success Criteria. When students know what they are learning, they are able to take responsibility for their own learning. The Success Criteria helps the students' show they have understood what they have learnt.

Learning Intention:

We are learning to retell events from a text.

Success Criteria:

I will be successful when I can:

- Explain what retelling is.
- Sequence the main events in a simple story and talk about them after reading.
- Write about what happened 'next' in the story.
