As we approach the end of Term 3, I want to take the opportunity to recognise the efforts of families, parents, siblings, carers as well as our college staff, who work incredibly hard to ensure that our students are here every day and ready to learn. School Council Report August 2023

School council met on Monday 28th August.

School Council worked through a number of important items and had reports from the Principal, the School Captains and College Staff about ongoing work towards achieving our AIP School Strategic Plan goals.

In particular, School Council celebrated the successes throughout Term Three, including programs such as the Year 9 Morrisby Careers Profiling interviews. Students completed skills and interests assessments, before receiving a one-on-one interview with a personal careers professional to help them think about their future studies and transitions.

The College Captains, Kisa and Ansh, discussed their new student voice project: working with Year 5 students to develop a student suggestion box for all college students. Students have worked closely with Mr Bayard to identify areas for suggestions that will also support the 2023 AIP goals.

James Damjanovski, the Truganina College Marrung Champion and Year 4 Classroom Teacher, gave a presentation to the School Council regarding work towards meeting our goals in relation to the <u>Marrung Education Plan</u>. Marrung is the Department of Education's 10-year strategic plan to develop Victoria into "...a state where the rich and thriving culture, knowledge and experience of our First Nation's peoples are celebrated by all Victorians;...". In particular, James presented on the College's progress in developing our Reconciliation Action Plan (or RAP), a key document all schools must have to ensure that they are part of Victoria's reconciliation journey. A key upcoming stage of this work will be in forming community working groups to discuss the RAP, the school's vision for reconciliation and actions to help achieve it in the next 12 months.

We encourage all families and parents to discuss being involved with the development of the RAP with our school council parent representatives.

There are many free resources on the website https://www.ruok.org.au/ and some very helpful tips, I'd encourage you to share with your families.




