Genre: Informative

Text Type: Explanation

Students explore how language, text structure and grammar, including formality, cohesion, and complex sentences work together to create purposeful and engaging written and spoken texts.

Genre: Imaginative

Text Type: Personal Narrative

Students analyse a range of spoken and written texts, exploring how authors use vivid language and figurative devices to engage readers, while crafting and sharing their own stories with well-structured ideas and carefully chosen words.

Informative

MATHEMATICS

Fractions

Students use factors and multiples to create equivalent fractions, represent and compare them on number lines and models, and justify their order by referring to benchmark fractions.

Addition & Subtraction

Students apply place value and whole-number strategies to add and subtract decimals to at least hundredths, exploring different methods and using estimation and rounding to check the reasonableness of their answers.

Time

Students measure, calculate and compare elapsed time, and interpret timetables and itineraries to plan activities and determine the duration of events and journeys.

Mass

Students investigate and convert between units of mass using the decimal system, use appropriate weighing devices, and apply strategies for multiplying and dividing decimals by powers of 10.

Shape

Students define and explore the features and properties of 2D and 3D objects, compare prisms and pyramids, and examine the shapes of faces and cross-sections of different objects.

History, Civics & Citizenship: Federation

Students learn about what defines a nation, the period before Federation of Australia when six colonies operated under different rules, the voices and debates that shaped federation, the creation of Australian Constitution, how Australia became a nation, issues of exclusion and equality at the time, how democracy works, the symbols of a new nation, differing viewpoints, and comparisons with other federations and empires around the world.

Students will explore what media is by investigating media languages and technologies, creating interviews and documentaries, and formally presenting their work.

SPANISH

Students learn to talk about holidays in Spanish, using past tense to describe what they have done and sharing their own holiday stories through speaking and reading activities. They also explore directions and locations, applying their language skills in practical tasks such as giving directions and participating in a walking tour.

Language

STEM

Students will explore data transmission and how digital systems work, keeping information secure, and create and share content, while developing skills in coding, problem-solving, and designing digital solutions.

HAPE

Students build endurance and performance through cross country and athletics, refining their skills across a range of track and field events. They also develop and apply advanced movement skills, including the two-hand strike, in active and competitive game settings.
